Of the Old Testament prophets there are sixteen whose prophecies form part of the inspired canon. These are divided into four groups:

(1.) The prophets of the northern kingdom (Israel):
Hosea, Amos, Joel, Jonah.

(2.) The prophets of Judah: Isaiah, Jeremiah, Obadiah,
Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah.

(3.) The prophets of Captivity: Ezekiel and Daniel.

(4.) The prophets of the Restoration: Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi.
